Pastor Emerita Post (P.E.P. Talk) November, 2025

Dear Family at North Pointe,

You may be aware Pastor Sue Barham is preaching a seven-week series titled: We Live We Love. She is focusing on stories from Genesis to explore our relationships with each other and God. She asked me to tell the ancient stories and called me a storyteller. (Who knew?)

Then on a recent Sunday, our closing hymn was "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms." I was reminded of a story that happened to me in 1986. The event was important for me in my relationships as a pastor.

Here's the story:

Half-way through the first verse of the opening hymn, I caught on. Finally, after growing up in a Methodist church, I caught onto the value and necessity of a faith community. It took me forty-five years to catch on.

I had completed my first year as a pastor and was standing behind the pulpit singing #133 in the United Methodist Hymnal: "What a fellowship, what a joy divine, leaning on the everlasting arms." I had been the pastor of these people long enough to have learned some of their personal histories. I knew the hymn well enough to look out over the congregation as I sang.

Ruth and Roger were there, standing and singing from their regular place among the eighty worshipers. They had both lost spouses to cancer and then found each other. In the third row on the right side, Bernie and Frank saw me and smiled as they sang. Years earlier, Bernie's first husband and father of their children, put a shotgun in his mouth and pulled the trigger. Owen and Gloria, who had buried a two-year old child, sang from the back pew. Bob's wife and two grandchildren had been killed in an accident with a semi. Hank's son was in prison. J.C. had lost his arm in a mishap with a corn-picker, Sandy had recently joined a support group for incest survivors ... and

... that's when it hit me! They were all singing! How could they sing? How could they experience such tragedies, yet come to worship every Sunday and sing?

That's when I caught on. Finally caught on. These folks had stories to tell and not just stories of tragedies. They had experiences of faith that transcended their suffering. Stories that might never be told, but by attending worship and singing these people were witnessing to their faith in the Christian Story of love overcoming death.

In my subsequent years of ministry, I learned to ask people what their favorite hymn or song was. And, if I asked why, I heard a story of grace moving in the midst of despair.

Since that Sunday, thirty years ago now, one of my favorite hymns is #133 in the United Methodist Hymnal. And, on that years-ago-Sunday, I don't know who started it, but during the chorus, folks began swaying back and forth, left to right, gently leaning against the shoulders of the people next to them.

"Leaning, leaning, safe and secure from all alarms;

leaning, leaning on the everlasting arms."


To gather in worship is to count on the everlasting arms in our faith community as well as to witness to the central story of our faith.
